Proxies will be available on our web page for those who prefer to download a copy.

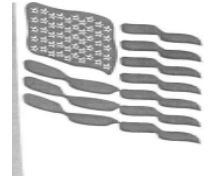

## Public Utility Commission of Texas - Electric Retail Competition

On June 18, 1999 Governor George W. Bush signed Senate Bill 7 to introduce retail competition in the electric utility industry to Texas. The new law is designed to give customers greater control and should lower the price of electricity over time, make new service products available, while assuring the same reliable service.

## Nuts & Bolts

It is the responsibility of the homeowner who intends to make an exterior modification to first submit a modification application and have it approved before the work begins. This protects the homeowner from potential expensive re-work to meet the civic association guidelines. In addition, the homeowner is required to apply for, and meet, all city building requirements. Modification Application forms are available from Crest Management or from our web page, [www.commonwealth-civic.com](http://www.commonwealth-civic.com).

### Considering having a pool installed?

If you are considering having a pool installed, please CUT AND SAVE the following information. The MDR committee has put together this information to assist anyone submitting an application for a pool.. This is provided in an effort to reduce the number of applications that are returned for lack of information. **Please note changes and additions.**

1. Obtain application from Crest Management (or [www.commonwealth-civic.com](http://www.commonwealth-civic.com))
2. Fill out application **completely** and return to Crest Management.
3. Attach a copy of your plan with the pool and deck location and dimensions indicated.
4. Indicate on plat: site access and all drain lines as well as location of all pool equipment.
5. Backwash and drain lines must drain to the street.
6. Blueprint of pool must indicate schedule 40 PVC used for all drain lines.
7. Pool and deck must be at least 5 feet from side and rear lot lines and should not encroach on any easements.
8. Pool and deck must be within building setback lines.
9. See 9.0 in your Architectural Control Guidelines for more details.

A deposit, if needed, must be received by Crest Management before authorization for building can be given.

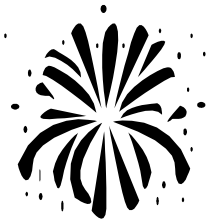

## Development Update

- The new Sam's Club next to Wal-Mart at State Highway 6 and U.S. Highway 90A is scheduled to open in the near future. Future developments near the 133,000-square-foot Sam's Club will include two restaurants.
- All or a portion of the undeveloped property located near New Territory is expected to be sold by the state late this summer. Although the planning and development of the property could begin upon the sale, actual construction of residential homes or commercial sites could take two to three years.
- The City is currently reviewing a developer agreement and general land plan submitted by Riverstone Development Company for a master-planned community located on State Highway 6 just west of Murphy Road/University Boulevard. While a portion of the development will be within Missouri City, approximately 2,200 acres of the community will be located within the extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) of Sugar Land. The 2,800-acre community anticipates 5,000 homes and 16,000 residents. An estimated 3,800 of these homes and 12,000 residents will be in Sugar Land's ETJ. Riverstone will have 300 acres of lakes; 500 acres of recreational complexes, open spaces and parklands; and 24 miles of pedestrian walkways and trails connecting 74 individual neighborhoods.

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Construction of the first segment of University Boulevard is expected to begin in May or June. It is expected to be completed within one year, depending on weather and the contractor's commitment to the schedule. Sugar Land and Fort Bend County have paid \$2 million for construction toward this phase of the project, which totals \$10 million; \$8 million in federal money was secured for construction. The City and County also paid 100% of the design of the project.

This first phase of the thoroughfare involves the extension of Commonwealth Boulevard over the levee and Ditch "H" with twin bridges. It will be a right angle turn to intersect with the new University Boulevard. This segment of University Boulevard (between the Commonwealth Boulevard extension and U.S. Highway 59) will be a four-lane roadway that will ultimately become a six- and eight-lane roadway. The eight-lane portion of the roadway will be located at the approach to the future Lexington Boulevard extension and U.S. 59. The existing Commonwealth 4-lane cross section will not be altered. There will be a 14' hike and bike trail on the west side (UH side) of University Boulevard.

The completion of this project should help relieve Elkins Road which is classified as a "collector". Both Commonwealth and University Boulevard are classified as "arterials" per our adopted Master Thoroughfare Plan. Therefore, they have been designed to accommodate higher traffic volumes for this classification. The City is aware that this Commonwealth connection to US 59 via University Boulevard will have an affect and will change driver behavior for the residents in the area. Therefore, once this first segment of University Boulevard is constructed, the City will be cognizant of this changing pattern and will make necessary changes to traffic control if it is necessary. Again, please remember that both Commonwealth and University are classified as "arterials".

***Council just approved additional street improvements such as adding a right turn lane on Sweetwater onto Lexington Blvd.***

### **Sugar Land to Assist Community Organizations with CDBG Funds**

Several Sugar Land community services have been identified for assistance as part of the City's first year of direct participation in the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. Sugar Land became eligible for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development program after reaching a population of 50,000; during the last three years, the City has been part of Fort Bend County's CDBG program. Funding approved for Sugar Land is \$322,000.

Community services groups to receive a portion of Sugar Land's CDBG funds include Fort Bend Community Revitalization Projects, Inc.; American Red Cross; Literacy Council of Fort Bend; Child Advocates of Fort Bend; and Fort Bend Seniors Citizens. Sugar Land's CDBG program also will include a parkland purchase in Mayfield Park, which is currently under negotiation; administrative expenses to ensure proper oversight of the federal funds; and services provided to elderly residents through the Sugar Land Parks and Recreation Department.

### **Traffic Signal Synchronization Keeps Motorists Moving (or...It's about Time!)**

Sugar Land's acquisition in November 2001 of the remaining state-owned traffic signals along State Highway 6 and U.S. Highway 90A is expected to improve mobility on City streets. Enhancements at the intersections along both corridors – including hardware that connects traffic signals via a radio system – will allow City technicians to monitor and remotely adjust the signals. This is based on traffic-congestion alerts originating from detectors installed in the roadway. The improvements will be funded through Sugar Land's Capital Improvements Program.

The upgraded signal system — combined with traffic management cameras that will be installed as part of an upcoming 2002 Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality (CMAQ) Traffic Signal Improvement Project — will help keep motorists moving and enable technicians to respond quickly to traffic-related incidents throughout the City.

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## The Commonwealth Pool Rules

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**Parents -- please be sure that your child/children know these rules as we enter pool season!**

The pool is open only during posted hours.

(Trespassers **will** be prosecuted!)

our web page!*

Pool tags are required for pool use.

Each household is limited to 8 guests per day.

Proper swim attire is required.

Pool use may be limited due to pool capacity AND/OR weather conditions.

The following rules apply:

No rough play

No glass containers

No alcohol

No pets

No running

No foul language or obnoxious behavior

No diving except by lifeguard approval

No bikes, scooters, skate boards, roller blades, etc.

No toys or floats except by lifeguard approval

### *Diving Board Rules:*

Only one person allowed on the diving board at a time

You must exit the diving board from the end and not from the side

Children under 10 years old must be accompanied by a responsible person at least 18 years of age.

**Lifeguards are authorized to enforce the pool rules. A lifeguard may require a resident or guest to leave the pool area.**

Children under the age of two must wear a swim diaper in the pool (and/or wading pool)
