Upcoming City and School Board Elections

City Council members Cyril Hosley, Russell Jones, Dennis Parmer, and Michael Schiff are each up for re-election this year. While things change quickly in Fort Bend politics, at the time of this writing, each of the City Council members will be seeking re-election.

Commonwealth is represented by Councilman Michael Schiff who is completing his first term on Sugar Land City Council. It is not known at this time whether or not Councilman Schiff will have an opponent. Updates are available on our web site.

The terms of FBISD School Board members Jane Clarke, Cynthia Knox and Arthur Pace will end this May. Mrs. Knox and Mr. Pace are both seeking re-election. Mrs. Clarke, after 12 years of service on the School Board, will not be running. She is leaving the area and will be relocating to Lufkin, Texas.

As you are undoubtedly aware, there has been a rash of home invasion burglaries over the past few months. It is critical that residents learn to protect themselves, and especially their children from these attacks.

Never open your door to strangers. Even if you are expecting someone to stop by, **ALWAYS** check to see who it is **BEFORE** opening the door.

It is suggested by law enforcement that if someone appears at your door, you should let them know you are home by speaking to them through the door, but do not open the door until you are sure it is safe.

Do not be tricked into letting anyone into your home to use your telephone. Offer to make the call for them.

If you feel threatened by the appearance of this person/people, call the police department and let them know what is transpiring.

Speak to your children and explain the dangers. It is not necessary to frighten them, but if they do not know this type of thing happens, they will be at risk.

Graffiti Alert

The custodial staff at Commonwealth Elementary has noticed an increase in graffiti and litter (beer cans, etc.) in the Pavilion at the rear of the school. If you notice suspicious vehicles or persons on school property at ANY time, please contact the **Fort Bend ISD Police Department at 281-634-5500**. There is a FBISD police officer on duty 24 hours a day/7 days a week. They will investigate and will pursue charges if necessary.

Additionally, there has been an increase in graffiti incidents within the Commonwealth neighborhoods. In the past few months alone, the Commonwealth Civic Association has spent about **\$2,000 to clean up graffiti on our monuments and public property.**

Landscape Color

In the mood for color? Color can create conversation, make food taste better, enhance creativity, and set the mood.

This is helpful to remember when you begin to think about planting those spring flower beds.

Because of the way we see colors, flowers and plants can change the perceived size of a garden/yard, call attention to a specific feature, or take attention away from a less than attractive feature of the yard.

Scientists say that red stimulates conversation and arouses our taste buds: something you might wish to consider for the backyard patio area.

Yellow creates many of the same effects as the color red.

Pink is perceived as being soothing, sweet-tasting and fragrant.

If you like things tidy and precise, white may be your color. White is associated with cleanliness, orderliness and precision. White is the last color to fade as darkness falls, so it might work well bordering walkways or in

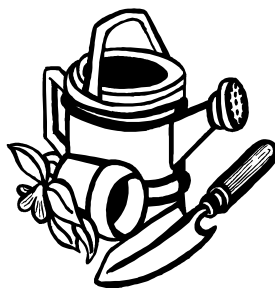
the areas you like to enjoy in the evenings.

Dark to mid-tone greens can impart an air of richness and luxury while lighter greens will give a more casual look. Green is also believed to relieve eyestrain.

Blue creates a feeling of coolness. Lots of blue flowers and foliage planted on the sides of a long and narrow garden will actually make it seem wider.

Gray is said to promote creativity, so if you go into your garden to think and relax consider planting a bed of gray.

Whichever way your personal preferences lean, with a little thought and effort, you can plant a spring garden you'll enjoy for months!

Memo from the Mayor of Sugar Land

This is the second in a series of quarterly newsletter articles presented by Sugar Land Mayor, David G. Wallace.

Spring has arrived in the City of Sugar Land and with the warmer temperatures, opportunities for outdoor activities abound.

Last spring, Governor Rick Perry awarded the “Fittest City in Texas” to Sugar Land. I hope you are joining us as we set the City’s goal this year, to not only win the 2005 award, but to also raise the bar with a three-year plan to become the “Fittest City in America”. The mission of the program, Shape up Sugar Land, is to make living an active and healthy lifestyle “irresistible” for all residents of Sugar Land. As an elected official, this time of year is a lot of fun as we have the opportunity to attend and participate in the opening days for the various youth

sports organizations. As a former “soccer dad”, it is great to see the excitement on the faces of the kids as they march onto the field on opening day in their new uniforms. Providing premier facilities for the youth sports leagues has always been a priority for the City of Sugar Land. League play is already underway for the Sugar Land Girls Softball Assc. at Imperial Park. This recently updated 44-acre park continues to see renovations with the addition of a new concession stand, restrooms and additional parking. First Colony and Sugar Land Little Leagues will begin their seasons in early April at First Colony Park and City Park respectively. Both parks have lighted fields, batting cages and receive heavy use. Also “kicking off” this spring, will be the First Colony and Sugar Land Soccer Clubs, playing at Lost Creek Park and Eldridge Park. Eldridge Park has seen a lot of recent improvements, especially in landscaping. If you are looking for good entertainment and exercise possibilities, visit any one of these parks, take in some league play and enjoy a long walk.

Our parks system recently added a new BMX track venue at Lost Creek Park. We hope that access to this popular sport will provide a fun additional outdoor activity for teens. There are no fees or organized scheduling, and I am confident it will receive a lot of use.

Last year, Sugar Land was selected as one of the top 100 places to live by HomeRoute, a national real estate marketing company. There is no doubt that our superior parks system is one of the reasons that Sugar Land is not only a great place to live, but also a great place to play. As residents, we enjoy access to top-rated parks and recreation facilities, complete with extensive parkland and greenbelts, hike and bike trails, picnic areas, volleyball courts, playing fields, tennis and swimming. The City has invested over \$12 million in the last 5 years in 350 acres of our parks system. We have a terrific parks staff, committed to getting the most for our tax dollars as well as capitalizing on grant opportunities, making our parks system exceptional.

Perhaps one of the most exciting future aspects of this system is the 529 acres making up the Brazos River Conservation Corridor. As District Four residents you will have the closest proximity and ease of access to the

park. It is truly going to be a jewel in the City's and the region's park system. Preliminary planning for this nine-mile stretch along the Brazos River was completed in 2004. Design for Phase I, a 420-acre park, is underway and will continue throughout 2005. This phase of the park is bounded by the Brazos River, Highway 59, the University of Houston Sugar Land, and University Boulevard. Construction should begin in 2006, with improvements to include conservation and recreational aspects. Trails, picnic facilities, amenity lakes, playground, multi-use fields and access to the river for canoeing are planned.

As you can see, exercise in Sugar Land doesn't require a special trip to the gym. Just pull on your walking shoes and enjoy one of the many amenities provided by your tax dollars. I hope you will join me in the challenge to **Shape up Sugar Land**, incorporating exercise into a healthy lifestyle. 
